



# BC MARINE TRAILS

## BCMT Code of Conduct

This marine trail site is within a sensitive natural environment. Please observe the following as part of the BC Marine Trails Code of Conduct:

- You are on sensitive First Nations traditional land. Treat this land with respect. Disturb nothing, take nothing.
- Best practice is to not have campfires. Any fires below high tide line only. No upland wood foraging; use driftwood only. Leave no visual evidence of fires. Adhere to fire bans.
- If a toilet is unavailable, no solid human waste should be left on site, either on the ground or buried. Best practice is to take it out to sea and discharge mid-channel. Alternatively, where shellfish won't be contaminated, dispose below the high tide line and ensure tidal flush sweeps it out to sea.
- Stay to the campsite area and on established trails to avoid trampling sensitive ecosystems.
- Best practice is to use the lowest intertidal marine area for gray water disposal. Pack out all solids and minimize or eliminate use of soaps.
- Maintain regulated distances from marine mammals and avoid disturbing wildlife. If you cause an animal to move, you are likely too close. Keep your site clear of food and other animal attractants. Never feed animals.
- Leave nothing behind after your visit. Leave a site in its natural state and modify nothing.
